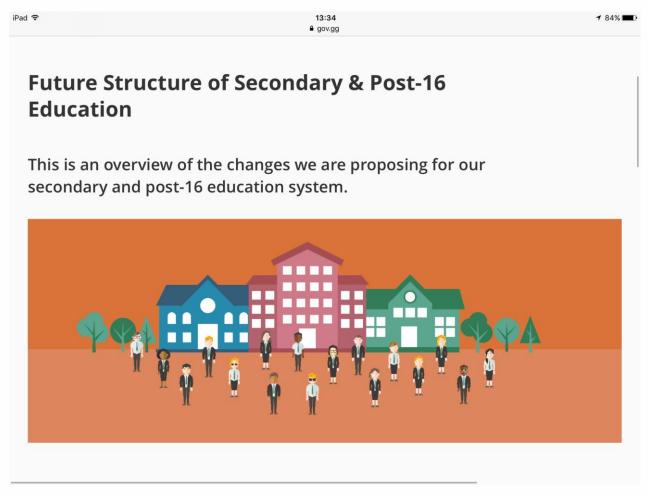

# Total Top 5 Aims for the GDA (2015)

- 1 Awareness and acceptance of the **RIGHTS** of disabled islanders
- 2 More disabled people in EMPLOYMENT
- 3 A person-centered **COMMUNITY CARE** and support system
- 4 ACCESS in all its forms (buildings, processes, customer services, recruitment, education, etc.)
- 5 RESPITE CARE available according to need
- 6 A supportive EDUCATION system and Pathways to HIGHER EDUCATION, training and lifelong learning
- 7 **INFORMATION** about existing support services
- 8 Accessible, affordable **HOUSING**

# Education proposals for secondary education

• The Committee for Education, Sport and Culture's (ESC) current plans for non-selective secondary schools have not included a review of how children with Special Educational Needs (SEN) might be affected by the current "three school" plan, or how such students' needs are to be accommodated within these schools. Nor, indeed, have the plans included a more general review of Guernsey's system of educating children with disabilities and SEN.

#### 1st priority

- Social acceptance and inclusion in society
- 2 Range of options for all needs
- 3 Less reliance on parents bringing professionals together
- 4 Individual needs assessed, met and regularly reviewed

#### 2nd priority

- 1 Best opportunity possible
- 2 Increase knowledge of staff (more effective referrals)
- 3 More co-ordination between top & bottom, strategy and implementation
- 4 Chance to achieve academic potential

#### 3rd priority

- 'Rubbing Off' Primary schools interactions good, kids understand the wider world and normal does not exist. Secondary poor
- 2 Reaching educational, social & emotional potential
- 3 Staff awareness of class. TA & needs
- 4 Agencies liaise with each other & school

#### 6th priority

- 1 Right equipment & technology to support children
- 2 High proportion dyslexic children(12 of 46 kids and limited support)
- 3 Support to interact socially
- 4 Better planning early transition and communication

#### 5th priority

- Attitude change at Education (open v closed) kept at arm's length
- 2 Need driven early Intervention v crisis intervention
- 3 Specialist back up for teachers
- 4 To achieve social integration and emotional wellbeing

#### 4th priority

- 1 Right environment for physical, emotional & different needs
- 2 Lack of Comm's Education & depts Access to support incl. voluntary
- 3 Staff training & awareness of different conditions and support
- 4 Respond to needs not budgets

#### Remaining priorities

- Parent volunteers (not for own child) to assist with support – who have knowledge of impairments, free up resources, be creative with resourcing
- · Learn social interactions such as texting
- · Safety of all children
- Parents as partners communication
- Measurable targets of inclusion
- Normalise differences if children in mainstream education – school ambassadors
- Individual Education Plan Implemented
- Statement of SEN quantified, detailed and measured, maybe frequency of review dropped if doing well
- Information for parents on who's who in education, eg. who to go to with questions.
- · Class size.
