Thank you to our presenters from Employment & Social Security (ESS) who are the lead committee for Equality & the Disability & Inclusion Strategy Deputies Michelle Le Clerc and Emilie Yerby, and Ed Ashton, Head of Operations ESS and lead on the Disability & Inclusion Strategy. This interactive session was well received, providing practical hints and tips on becoming more inclusive. States services have nominated key individuals to attend the Centre for Accessible Environments (CAE) training to increase awareness on making States environments more accessible for customers and employees.

DisabledGo are attending the Access For All's AGM on 7 November, to provide an update on accessible guides published on DisabledGo Guernsey. You will also be invited to join DisabledGo in December when they will explain what is involved in an accessibility guide review. This will include the option of working with DisabledGo to undertake a review of small venues in Guernsey to be published on the website.


