Exciting changes ahead for GROW

Welcome to our first monthly Newsletter featuring updates on life and times at GROW and our future plans.

We shall introduce Crew members and highlight the role our staff play in providing a safe and secure working environment where Crew receive training and mentoring in a stimulating work environment, encouraging them to develop their self-confidence, workplace and life skills, so they can achieve their full potential in life.

There are big changes ahead for GROW as we prepare for the redevelopment of our viney site in the Coutanchez. Plans were

given final approval in December 2020 so fundraising has begun in earnest.

We aim to raise £1.5million by October, to give us the confidence to relocate our operation to temporary accommodation and begin clearing the site. Fundraising will continue until we have raised the anticipated £2.5million to complete the project.

All things going to plan the GROW disability community hub will re-open in the spring of 2023. ■

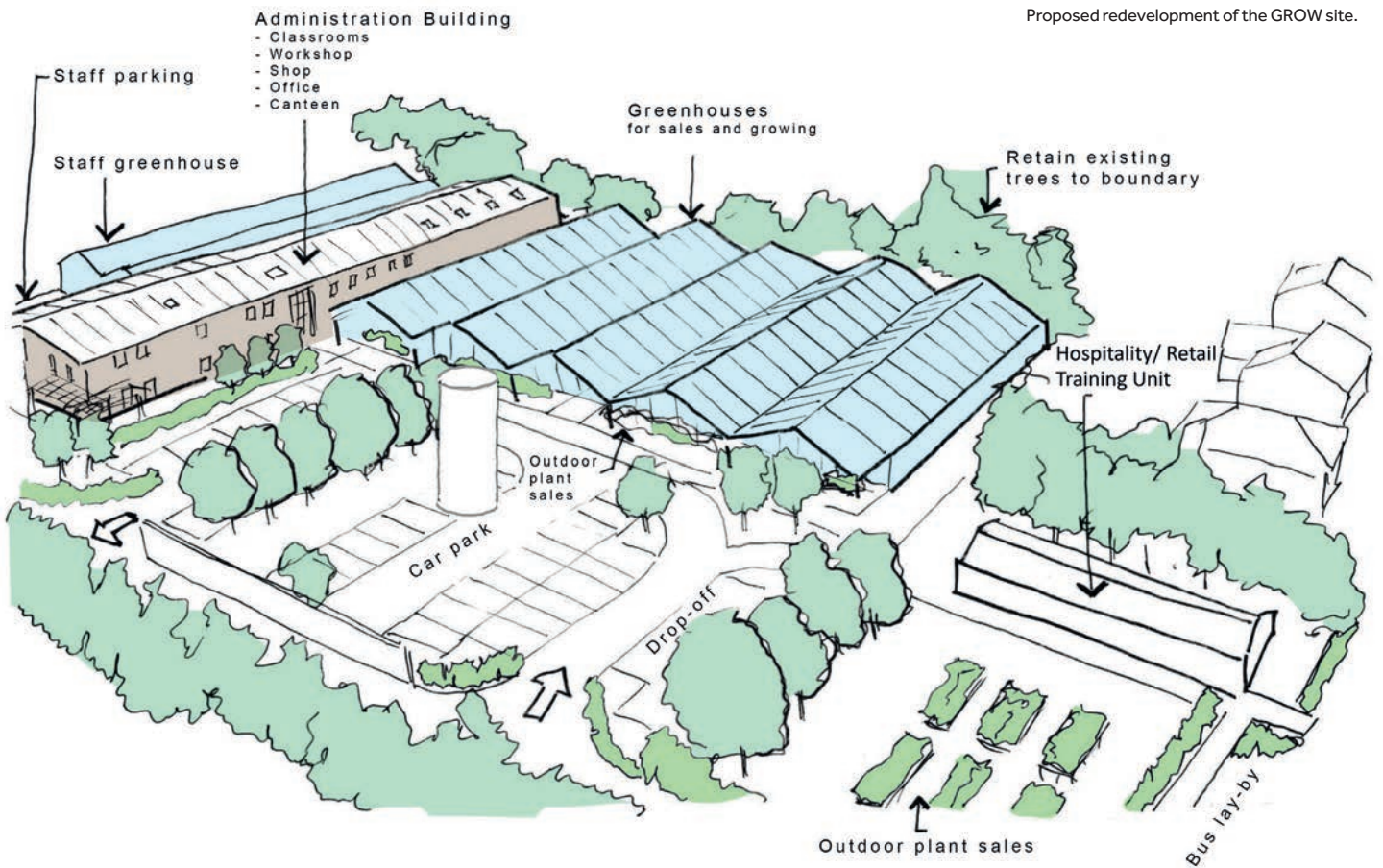
Spring Tips

Andrew Chandler – Supervisor at GROW

Ever since I can remember I have had an interest in growing, farming and helping people. It's led me along an interesting path of life and careers.

I am Guernsey born: my parents became gardeners, as many have done, to help feed us as a family. My sister and I were roped in to help with sowing, maintaining and harvesting vegetables and fruit, while over the hedge from our bungalow I was fascinated and encouraged to help the farmers who grew crops and reared cattle.

After a short, but successful career in farming, I left the Island to pursue a people focused vocation as a Catholic Priest, where after eight years training I worked in parish and hospital ministry as well as being chaplain to people with disabilities for just over ten years.

I overcame my own personal disability with a stammer, not a helpful one when standing before four hundred people leading them through words!

So, the opportunity to work in a happy, supportive, caring and encouraging environment where all of us with our own struggles offer a place of support and opportunity for all to GROW was an opportunity I could not miss. ■

I am a local Guernsey girl and left Le Murier School in 2012; then studied at the College of Further Education but found it difficult to get a job afterwards. I took a placement at GO. Then another charity helped me find a placement at GROW.

I love it here! I've been taught how to use a lawnmower, strimmer, hedge cutter and leaf blower – so I can keep people's gardens tidy. I also work on the vinery and help grow the fruit and vegetables. We deliver produce to restaurants and nursing homes.

It's great getting out and about learning where places are. I like to show people around the vinery and help them find certain plants that they like. Learning the names of the plants and varieties of vegetables makes me feel good so I can pass on my knowledge to other people and show them how to do things properly.

I come to GROW three days a week and sometimes I help at the Trinity Café. I like meeting new people and my confidence has grown being at GROW; the staff are really great and give me time to learn. It makes me feel good about myself. Ultimately, I want to make my family proud of me and GROW is helping me to do that! ■
